This month, a fresh batch of Good Vision Technicians began their training, empowering grassroots women with skill-based employment and extending the reach of eye care to the last mile.








PALASUNI EYE CAMP WITH ASHA WORKER SUPPORT

STORIES OF CHANGE

SINAMI PIRBAKA (RAYAGADA, ODISHA)

At 55, Sinami had trouble identifying faces or watching her grandchildren play. After attending a local camp, she received a pair of glasses that changed her life. "These glasses brought light back into my life," she says.



SUMATI & AMULYAMANI (MAYURBHANJ, ODISHA)

Two elderly women, supported by pensions, found renewed independence after receiving prescription glasses at our Betnoti Block camp. "I can help my family again," said Amulyamani.







JUBATI PATRA (DHENKANAL, ODISHA)

A homemaker who struggled with chores now sees clearly and lives confidently, thanks to a timely intervention.



ANAMIKA JENA (BHUBANESWAR, ODISHA)

This 13-year-old had difficulty seeing the blackboard. A free eye check-up and a pair of glasses have brought her back on track in school.







SITARAM BHOI (LOHARDAGA, JHARKHAND)

A 60-year-old farmer whose work was affected by poor vision now manages his farm with clarity and comfort.







EYE HOSPITAL PARTNERSHIPS

GoodVision India has partnered with Nayan Deep Eye Hospital in Dhanbad to provide sponsored cataract surgeries. In addition, through its collaboration with Trinetram Eye Hospital in Jamshedpur, GoodVision India offers sponsored surgeries for needy cataract patients. Similarly, in association with Vision Care Eye Hospital in Bhubaneswar, GoodVision India extends support by offering sponsored cataract surgeries to underserved patients in Odisha.









JHARKHAND OUTREACH

From Jamshedpur to Dhanbad, our work extended to industrial communities and slums. Beneficiaries like **Gori Devi, Rita Roy** and **Rajan Raj** reported significant improvements in daily life after receiving their glasses.
